Dispatches From the Territorial Governor

OK,,, something different this month, and the next three, too if it's ok with you... The batwing doors in the Saloon snap open and in walks the meanest, toughest, roughest hombre the Saloon denizens had ever seen..... And right behind HIM walks Sweetwater Jack..... With a small wooden soap box. Oh, you know what's comin' then.

OK, I know you've THOUGHT about it. And you REALLY kinda' think it might be FUN. But what is this shootin' BLACK POWDER CARTRIDGE stuff all about? What about the MESS?! An' havin' to CLEAN UP yer' guns IMMEDIATELY or they'll turn into rusted pieces of JUNK! And all that stuff about loadin' shells by VOLUME? An' all that "LUBE COOKIE" stuff?? Well, most of what you hear is BUNK! Let's take this stuff one step at a time:

1. Black Powder is HIGHLY CORROSIVE and will rust your guns tighter'n a duck's butt in cold water.
 - a. Nope! The corrosive compounds were mostly in the PRIMERS of the early black powder cartridges. If you use modern primers (and who doesn't?) you've eliminated 99% of that problem. Actually, some of the modern "black powder substitutes" are more corrosive than "real" black powder. (Pyrodex, for one) Some prefer to clean their guns on the tailgate of their trucks right after a match, others do it right after unloadin' the truck at home and before we even eat supper (old military training dies hard). Some folks (dare I say it?) even wait a couple of DAYS before cleaning their guns. It's NOT a problem! Of course I'm NOT sayin' to just chuck 'em into yer gun safe fer a month, either! What I AM sayin' is they should be cleaned as soon as you can, just like with shootin' SMOKELESS powder. NO, J.D., I'm not tryin' to change YOUR life....
 2. Clean up takes FOREVER and is a huge MESS! Ya' gotta' buy all KINDS of special cleaning stuff!
 - b. Nope! There are about as many "favorite" concoctions for cleaning up black powder guns as there are folks who shoot 'em, everything from Cabela's BP Solvent, vinegar and water, Ballistol and water 1-10 (moose milk), Palmolive Dishwashing Liquid and water, Simple Green diluted 2oz to a gallon of water, etc. Notice one key ingredient that seems to be runnin' through this thread? Yep, WATER! Black powder fouling is easily cleaned with WATER! My SxS shotguns are cleaned after shooting by first removing the barrels and running water through 'em with a plastic nozzle on a GARDEN HOSE! If they've seen more than 25 to 30 plastic wads go through, I plug the muzzles with a couple of rubber stoppers from the hardware store, fill the barrels with "Moose milk" (See below) let 'em set for about 15 minutes and then drain it out, and tear a paper towel in half, wad it up and stuff half the towel down each barrel with a dowel or cleaning rod. If you are using plastic wads, the plastic goop comes right out and your barrels are shiny bright. I usually pull a "Bore-Snake through after that. Preserve with whatever gun oil is your favorite (I swear by my aerosol cans of Ballistol), wipe the action with Ballistol or whatever preservative you use and you're done! For pistols, pull the cylinder as you usually do, and flush barrel and cylinder with HOT soapy water or 1-10 Ballistol/water. Dry and lubricate. I've started using a piece of shipping tape to cover the bolt and "hand" holes to keep water out of the innards. No different than your smokeless cleanup. On your rifle, chamber a spent shell that came from THAT rifle to make a "chamber seal" and swab the barrel with your hot soapy solution, run some patches down there until dry and clean and spray with your preservative lube. Remove the spent brass and wipe where you can get into the works and spray with Ballistol or use your regular oil. That's it. If you start using Ballistol, keep in mind that it is a NON-Petroleum product and the gun should be thoroughly purged of petro-chemicals with something like "Gunscrubber" or auto brake cleaner, then dried, and Ballistol applied to all surfaces. Be careful not to get the gunscrubber/brake cleaner on any of the wood. It'll do a job on the finish. The Ballistol can be used on all parts of the guns, including the wood. It's non-toxic and biodegradable. I'll get into loadin' shells for your rifle and pistols next month!
