October's Spook 'n' Shoot...

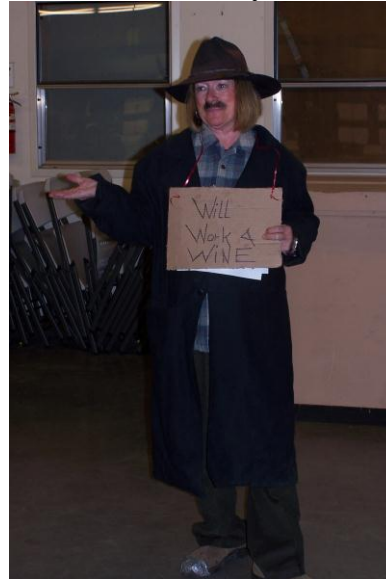

Being unsure just what a "Gumfighter" does..., I'll leave General Lee Goode to do it....

Dispatches From the Territorial Governor

Seems there are still a few questions out there about Overloading the rifle:

... **Overloading a rifle on a stage is not a safety issue.** The safety comes into play if the shooter has any rounds left in the rifle after he/she has fired the rifle and committed to the next gun. Then, and only then, a safety shall be issued if a live round is left anywhere in the rifle.

Should the shooter realize that they have loaded too many rounds and safely ejects those rounds, it's a no call.

Should the shooter fire more rounds than called for in the stage, it would be a "P" for using ammunition that was illegally acquired.... **What's the Call?** Application of related existing rules/penalties

Stage calls for 9 rounds in the rifle. Shooter loads 10 rounds at the loading table.

Whats the call if:

1. Shooter shoots 9 rounds and ejects the 10th round...safely restages rifle "open & empty".
NO CALL – NO MSV penalty for overloading – Rifle is considered "safe to leave shooter's hands".

2. Shooter kicks out the first round and then shoots the next 9 rounds.
"P" + miss (use of "illegally acquired" ammunition)

3. Shooter shoots 5 rounds, then kicks one out, and then shoots the next 4 rounds.
"P" + miss (use of "illegally acquired" ammunition)

4. Shooter shoots 9 rounds then puts down open rifle and then shoots the next gun.
MSV for an unfired round remaining in long gun action or magazine

...Or...

SDQ if round is chambered (e.g. lever closes when restaged)

So what's the key, here? If you jack one out, **AND YOU'VE OVERLOADED THE RIFLE AT THE LOADING TABLE** you must replace the round immediately after kicking out the live round and then jack out the extra (s) after completing the firing string before going to the next firearm. This will avoid the "use of illegal ammunition" and the "P" + miss, MSV or SDQ.... No, actually, the KEY here is pay attention to the stage instructions and DON'T overload the rifle at the loading table!!!

NO SASS Convention and Cowboy Christmas 2012

I just received word (as most of you did), that SASS will NOT be holding an Annual Convention in 2012.

I certainly hope this is NOT the death-knell of the SASS Convention. Gaye and I have not missed any of the Conventions, and each and every one was worth the drive (sometimes through 100 miles of snow and ice in a 2-wheel drive pickup truck) if for no other reasons than the great seminars, camaraderie with our fellow SASS members, colorful and sometimes amazing costumes and of course, the Territorial Governor Summit meetings, which although often a verbal bloodbath, hammered out some good rules and guidelines (usually).. The Wild Bunch has only said no Convention in 2012, and NOT "no more Conventions at all, but I'm very concerned.....

And now, how about loading up black powder shotgun shells? Hard? Nope..

One of the keys to successful reloading of smokeless powder shot-shells is wad pressure, where you have to get a good combination of powder quantity, wad height/length, and shot quantity. In smokeless reloading you'd best stick very closely to the manufacturer's recipes (usually the powder manufacturer) to achieve loads that do what you want and expect, without creating dangerous overpressures, or "blooper" loads.

Black powder loads are similar but not as pressure-critical for good performance in Cowboy Action Shooting. As I only shoot 12 gauge my article will stick to that gauge. Once again, yes, you can use your regular shotshell

loader for black powder, as you can for cartridge ammo. What powder granulation? Most folks use **FFg** for shotguns. If you feel you want a little more “oomph” with the same powder and shot quantities, switch to **FFFg**. (Don’t use **FFFFg** (4Fg) as it is too finely granulated and is made for the “flash pan” of flint-lock rifles and burns way hotter than **FFg** or **FFFg**. If you are using a black powder substitute instead of the real thing, use the same granulation as for real black powder. How much? Between 50 and 60 grains (volume) works well for a typical 1 1/8 oz shot load in 12 Ga. I’ve been using an old and inexpensive MEC 600Jr. for about 40 years and it works just fine with the 1 1/8 oz shot bar and the #44 powder bushing. I use Winchester Red Wads or any other plastic wad brand that has the SAME height from bottom of the shot cup down to the base. This gives enough wad pressure to make sure the wad is fully down against the powder and still produces a good solid “star” crimp at the shell mouth. How about using the classic over-powder nitro card wad, then a fibre filler/compression wad and finally a thin cardboard over-shot wad? Are you nuts? I’m WAY too lazy to do all that..!!!! As with the metallic cartridge, the resizing and re-priming is the same, whether you use a simple MEC loader or the Dillon 900 Shotgun press. I actually prefer to use my MEC 600Jr, rather than the Dillon. Slower, but I’m usually only reloading two or three boxes at a time, not 20. Use the same brand of primers you use for your smokeless shells, I usually use Winchester or Federals. The hardness/softness of the primer cups isn’t a real factor in the shotshells as it is with rifle and pistol ammo, unless you’ve REALLY lightened the hammer springs in your shotgun. Hulls? I stick with Winchester AA’s or Remington’s green STS hulls, mostly as they “shuck” better out of my SxS. (The b/p shells WILL heat up the barrels a lot faster than the smokeless loads do, and ribbed hulls (and those with aluminum bases) “stick” in the chamber more than smooth ones with low brass bases. And as I’ve said before....clean those SxS barrels the EASY way. At the end of the day, take the barrels off, turn the hot water tap in the old laundry sink on, let the water get HOT and run the water down those barrels ! That gunk should run right down the drain. If there is still plastic wad residue (the following doesn’t really apply if you forsake the ease of the modern plastic wads and go full out for authenticity and use fibre, etc. “card” wads...) in there, go to my “secret” process. Plug the muzzles with a pair of those rubber stoppers you bought at Ace Hardware (you took your shotgun barrels into the store with you to get the right size stoppers, right?) pour in a mixture of 1 part Ballistol Sportsman’s Oil (From Cabelas usually) to 10 parts water, making “moose-milk” you keep in a plastic milk jug) and stand the barrels in the corner while you clean the rest of your guns. (About 20 minutes to a half hour will do the trick) Pour the “used” moose milk back into the jug for next time, and tear a paper towel in half and wad each half into the chambers. Shove the wadded paper through the barrel and out the muzzle. You’ll get a black or grey plastic “snake” that was the wad residue out. Run a “bore snake” through from breech to muzzle and put the barrels up to the light and be amazed at how clean and shiny the bores are. Have fun! SWJ
