Dispatches From the Territorial Governor

This year's SASS Convention and Territorial Governor Summit, held as it has been for the past ten years at the Las Vegas Riviera Hotel, had all the glamour and excitement that has made it a great part of the Cowboy Action Shooting year for so many of us in the past. There were more seminars this year than ever before, and the entertainment was lively as usual. What was missing was YOU! I believe that attendance was down again this year, and I sure saw a lot more empty spaces in the vendors rows than previous years. Gaye Abandon and I have attended every Convention since the first one in 2002, and it looks like we MAY have attended our last one. As you know by now there will NOT be a SASS Convention in 2012. We hope it is just a temporary pause until a new contract with possibly a different hotel can be secured. As your Territorial Governor,, most of my days were taken up in the T/G summit discussing or cussing the agenda items, and I hope that the voting on the 5 items this year went the way you all hoped they would. Believe me, there was a **LOT** of "lively discussion" on some of the items. (No blood on the walls this year, though).... As you know, the results of this year's voting were as follows:

Item #1 (Changing the scoring program so that a shooter that DNFs 2 or more stages in a match cannot win any main match awards) **PASSED**

All other items FAILED to gather a 2/3 majority for acceptance and went down to defeat. Item #5 which removed 8 of the Ladies Categories from the list of "Approved/Official" Categories (even though they were reinstated in the modified form finally voted upon) was still defeated. You may put down your carving knives, ladies,,, and please remember that I was just the "messenger" if it HAD passed.....

The Banquet and Yesteryear Ball was a Masquerade this year, as it was a few years back. The costuming was something to see..... I'm not sure if the guy in the gold cape, Roman-type helmet and short sword was Mark Anthony or Spartacus (His female companion's make-up appeared to make her "Cleopatra", so I guess my first guess was right.) The GAF provided the color guard for the opening ceremony of the ball and I guess we did OK though they added a third flag on us at the last moment..... Canada was represented this year... so I grabbed a "volunteer" dressed as a "Mountie"... (Hope nobody noticed that the maple leaf was upside-down... I didn't.....until we'd retired the colors.....)

As a final note, here are the R.O. Committee's "Clarifications and Discussions" that will be edited into the Shooter's Handbook and R.O. 1 manual in the near future:

.....

1. **Clarification of rules re: DECOCKING** (as posted on SASS Wire 11/26/11)

Decocking may not be done to avoid a penalty if cocked at the wrong time, position, or location once a round has gone downrange. NO gun may be decocked on the firing line except by pointing it downrange and pulling the trigger or while under the direct supervision of a stage officer/Timer Operator. The penalty for de-cocking is a Stage DQ.

SHB p23 / RO 1 p16

"Under the direct supervision" requires the TO's acknowledgement in an instructive or affirmative manner. In other words there must be a positive indication to the shooter that the TO is giving his approval for the shooter's action.

2: **Re: NAVY PEPPERBOX REVOLVER** Noting that it is assembled on a "Colt Navy frame, it qualifies as a **MAIN MATCH** revolver, and thus is disqualified as a "**Pocket Pistol**" (regardless of barrel length.)

- 3 **Re: 38 S&W Spl. Is LEGAL for PLAINSMAN sidematches.** (originally introduced in 1899 as a blackpowder round.)
4. BASIC RULES FOR THE LONG-RANGE COMPETITIONS (SHB p18 bullet #4) *Optical and receiver sights are not allowed* **EDIT FOR CLARIFICATION: Receiver mounted sights are not allowed. OPTICAL sights are only allowed in that category.**
5. ROC Ruling: NO to the use of a 12ga/.70 Cal. “slug gun” in SASS Long Range Rifle sidematches. Shotguns using slugs are NOT legal as a RIFLE.
6. There is a mobile app being used DURING Long Range Sidematches to calculate info for sight adjustment (Real-time info, including elevation, temperature, humidity, etc. inputs combined with preset individual firearm/ammo data.) One person punches in the numbers & provides sight adjustment info to the shooter. In addition to rangefinders, the use of this or any similar device is a sidematch DQ.
7. BISLEY HAMMER on a Ruger OLD ARMY percussion revolver? Super BlackHawk hammers on a ROA are OK under the current “Firearms Covenants” Lower and/or wider hammers on percussion revolvers fall under the same allowance as for cartridge pistols. BISLEY hammers (modified or not) installed on ANY revolver without the BISLEY Gripframe are still NOT ALLOWED.
8. Clarification re: Ammunition-related “Outlawed/Illegal” items will be covered under: The “Use of illegally-acquired ammunition” penalty.
9. There is no prohibition re: wearing a rifle/pistol ammo slide over SG loops on an ammo belt (as there IS in regard to a SHOTSHELL ammo slide.) Sewing the rifle/pistol loops directly to a shotshell loop on either a slide or belt is acceptable.
10. HANDBOOK EDIT: (due to oversight) ADD single-shot shotguns to PLAINSMAN sidematch rules SHB p17
11. HANDBOOK EDIT: (Clarification) Re: OCTAGON BARRELS on REVOLVERS: BARRELS: Original barrels may be replaced with new barrels of correct styles (eg. round, octagon, half-round) for that particular TYPE firearm. (Original wording said: MODEL of firearm)
12. EDIT: Dropped Firearm **Definition:** *A firearm that has left the shooter’s control and come to rest at a location or position other than where it was intended.* RO1 “Glossary of Terms” p 30
- 13 Clarification: What is meant by “in-hand” as applied to loaded revolvers? (This will be added to the next edit of the RO1 “Glossary of Terms”) REVOLVER IN HAND is defined as it applies to:

Holstered = Muzzle clear of the mouth of the holster (ie. “out of leather”)

Staged = Muzzle no longer in contact with the surface of the initial staging point.

This provides the same allowance for a “full grip” on the second (loaded) revolver while firing the first no matter how/where the revolver(s) start on the stage. Once the muzzle clears the holster or all contact is broken with the prop, the shooter is in violation if not registered as a GF or BW competitor. Discussion at the T/G Summit was also conducted regarding “spare” percussion cylinders being charged AND capped while OUT of the revolver’s frame. It is allowed to have a “charged” cylinder (powder, ball and any wadding used loaded into the chambers) out of the frame, but none of the nipples may be “capped”. A charged and capped cylinder is much the same as a hand grenade...
